Moorelands Kids exists to empower kids to help transform their lives.

Our success as an organization comes through a strong belief system, clear and compelling values, mission and vision, and the dedicated hard work of talented individuals.

We have talent all around us – the kids we serve, our staff and the numerous volunteers that give in their own unique way. It is this talent that enabled us to support more kids at camp and after-school programs, implement a powerfully engaging new website, move our offices to a new location to better reach our kids as our programs expand. We also achieved greater diversity on our Board of Directors through the addition of new Directors. With initiatives such as these we will be nicely positioned to progress our future. We have much to be thankful for.

We experienced growth in our programs – more kids, new programs, new donors and new relationships.

During 2019, due to unexpected circumstances that impacted our fundraising results, we experienced a financial shortfall of approximately \$76,000 in our General Fund. The organization maintains a healthy operating reserve to fund our operations and thereby ensure the continuity of our programs when shortfalls such as this occur. This will be an area of focus in 2020 for the organization.

In 2020, the Board of Directors and Staff are committed to continuous improvement as we serve the kids in our community. We will continue to invest in our programs, how we govern, our staff, and our practices, keeping Moorelands Kids strong, impactful and relevant to kids coping with economic instability and lack of opportunity.

Executive Director's Report



Typically a child's world is very small, but even they know that the world is an uncertain place.

Partnering with Moorelands Kids means you have the opportunity to transform a child's life. Your support helps them write their own success story.

At Moorelands Kids, we help children prepare for a better future. We know that providing the opportunity for children to develop positive habits and qualities

gives them the tools they need to break the cycle of poverty and experience success in relationships, education and employment.

Globally, we look to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)* – a plan to transform the world by 2030. Their blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all includes: ending poverty, promoting lifelong learning, and preparing children for their economic future.

At Moorelands Kids, this is the essence of what we do.

In 2019, 89% of *BLAST* kids reported that their time at program had taught them to be more respectful; 91% of *LED* participants told us that they had grown in confidence; 92% of camper families reported their child could use their newfound leadership skills in the community. We invest in children, teaching them skills and instilling hope for a strong, positive future.

This is transformation.

You may remember Molly. Last year, she was the youth speaker at our Annual General Meeting where she shared what the support of Moorelands Kids has meant in her journey. She was looking forward to the summer as she had been hired as a Cabin Leader at *Moorelands Camp*.

Seeing Molly's work with the campers inspired me; her strength was evident. At the end of the first camp session, even as one of the younger staff, she was known as a strong leader, a great example, skilled and smart! Her leadership skills will bring her success in the future. Seeing her strength and influence in the community gave me hope for the future of so many of our kids.

In 2019, we served more kids in every one of our programs and had the opportunity to serve kids more through many initiatives. However, we experienced a shortfall in fundraising which made balancing the budgets a challenge. As leaders, we focus on what we can learn from this experience and move forward. We need to reach more kids. Toronto is the inequality capital of Canada. There is so much need among our children. Our fundraising efforts will continue while we pursue new resources and relationships to ensure that more children can experience success at Moorelands Kids.

In the following pages you will see the transformative effects of your support in the lives of the children we serve. None of this would be possible without our amazing staff, board members, volunteers, donors and community partners. I want to thank you for your time, commitment, dedication and support over the past year – I have personally felt that on all levels. You are such an incredible community of people and sharing our strengths makes us stronger. I am so proud to be on this mission with each and every one of you.

A 60% increase in *Christmas Sharing* adopters means you help more families than ever before. Your support transforms the festive season with gifts, supplies and groceries for 956 children and babies in 2019.

Programs to Empower Kids!

Moorelands Kids is committed to building the next generation of leaders. We believe that every child has strengths regardless of their life circumstance. Our programs give kids facing economic barriers the opportunity to develop life-changing skills and a safe place in which to practise them. All Moorelands programs align with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals 2030, aimed at ending poverty and building opportunity and resilience in the world's young people.

Kids from low-income families face an opportunity gap. Today, evolutions in the full-time jobs market means the majority of our families are trying to survive on less than \$24,000 per family, per year.

For our kids, poverty is so much more than just financial. It impacts a child's self-esteem, social interactions, relationships and mental and physical health.

BLAST

BLAST (Budding Leaders After-School Teams) is an after-school program with 420 spaces for children aged 6-12, offered at public schools in the high-needs Thorncliffe Park and Flemingdon Park communities. *BLAST* is play with purpose. Your support empowers children as young as six to develop the critical literacy, numeracy, socio-emotional and leadership skills they need to succeed while they are kept safe after school. We offer a rich variety of activities including STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), sports and physical literacy, art, homework help, games, drama, cooking classes and field trips.



LED

LED (Lead, Excel, Demonstrate) is an after-school leadership program with 75 spaces/semester for youth in grades 6-8. In 2019, we stretched to serve 149 youth at Valley Park Middle School, Humber Summit

Middle School and Gulf Stream Public School. *LED*'s 9-week program is offered each semester. It challenges tweens to explore their role in community building while developing skills in problem solving, teamwork, leadership, goal setting and communication. Your support provides the guidance tweens need to make good choices as they work, hands-on, to be a positive influence in their community.

VITAL

VITAL (Volunteers In Training As Leaders) is a high school leadership and pre-employment program with 25 spaces for youth in grades 9-12. *VITAL* is only offered at Marc Garneau C.I. and is a hands-on program, designed to help youth master the skills and character qualities they need to become leaders in their community and to be successful in school and the workplace. Youth earn community volunteer hours and practise important community engagement as they mature in the program.

Research from the Search Institute shows that in order for kids to thrive now, and in the future, they need important developmental assets and relationships, including the following, which are found and developed at Moorelands Kids' programs. Thanks to YOUR support in 2019, more kids than ever before were able to develop the Moorelands Kids' Habits & Qualities and important developmental relationships at our programs, giving them the tools to succeed.



Young people need

opportunities—outside of school—to learn and develop new skills and interests with other youth and adults.



Young people need to feel safe,

valued and valuable. They need strong, positive relationships with caring adults and peers.



Young people need

to value learning and believe in themselves and their own abilities.



Young people need the skills to

interact effectively with others, to make difficult decisions, and to cope with new situations.



Young people need to develop strong

guiding values or principles to help them make healthy life choices.

Moorelands Camp

Moorelands Camp is an overnight summer camp near Dorset, Ontario, serving 700 kids aged 8-16. Costs are highly subsidized to create opportunities for children facing financial barriers. A week at summer camp offers children the opportunity to experience nature while developing skills through key program areas including swimming, canoeing, kayaking, arts & crafts, archery, sports and a ropes course, led by qualified instructors and caring mentors. Like *BLAST*, it's play with purpose and a place to have magical new experiences while out of the city and when making new life-long friends.

LEDGE (Learn, Experience, Deepen, Grow, Empower) is an experiential leadership learning program for youth in Grade 9 (14 years old) designed to challenge biases and encourage leadership skills over one session at camp.

STEP (Serve, Transform, Excel, Practice) is a 12-day advanced leadership and pre-employment program for youth in Grade 10 (15 years old), hosted at camp, where youth practice leadership, problem solving, project design, team building and job shadowing along with the traditional camp out-tripping experience.

Christmas Sharing

Christmas Sharing brings Christmas to families that otherwise wouldn't have the opportunity to have a traditional Christmas experience.

This Adopt-a-Family program requires one participant already be enrolled in our summer camp or after-school programs. In 2019, we served 956 kids – a 17% increase to children served. Your support brings joy to the holiday season and to those in need.



projectDIVE!

With your support, we launched *projectDIVE!* (Develop, Increase, Validate, Explore Leadership) in summer 2019 – an advanced leadership program with 110 spaces for campers in grade 3-8 who have demonstrated their desire to be positive leaders during their previous *Moorelands Camp* experience. Campers return for a second week at camp to strengthen and develop their leadership learning. They set tangible goals to become a person of influence for the benefit their community at home and for the benefit of the environment as a whole.



Baby Bundles

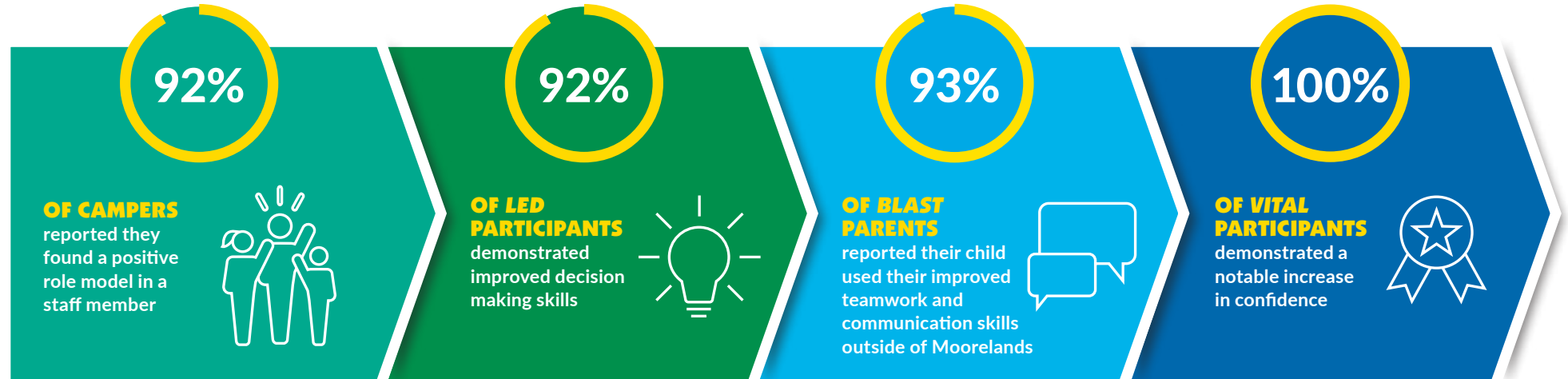
Baby Bundles, our second family program, is aimed at moms & newborns living in isolation or at risk of economic instability. In 2019, you made it possible for us to deliver 337 *Baby Bundles* – that's a 45% increase! Your support provides new mothers and newborns living below

the poverty line with access to supplies and community supports during their most vulnerable time.

We Are Intentional. We Transform Lives

We intend that children gain skills, experience personal growth, develop confidence and make friends because they have been to Moorelands Kids.

Sarah's Story

Sarah, age 13, is a Moorelands' camper and LED participant.

In the past, Sarah used to get in trouble at school because, in her own words, "most of the time people say I'm a bit extra..." Going to Moorelands Kids' programs year round has helped her a lot. Her mom, Lorrie, learned about our camp and after-school programs from outreach at Sarah's school. She likes our focus on leadership development: "I knew this would be something Sarah could benefit from," so last year she signed her up for the new LED program at Humber Summit.

Sarah attended both semesters of LED and found it really improved her performance at school: "I like LED because it's fun, but it also helped me become more respectful and it taught me how to communicate properly. The things you learn at Moorelands Kids help with almost everything! I didn't really know how to express myself without getting into trouble before, but now I stop and try to think ahead. It's helped me plan and set goals for myself in school. I get in trouble less now and can focus better on what we're doing in class."

Sarah's proud of how she's grown because of Moorelands Kids. "[In Summer 2019] I got to camp for my second year and got a leadership award for caring. Now I know that a leader is someone who helps others; someone who shows younger kids what to do by how you act and being a good example."

Transforming Lives Together

A nationwide decrease in child poverty contrasts with an increase in inequality in Toronto.

Toronto has the highest child-care costs in Canada = huge barriers for parents to work = high child poverty, particularly among newcomers.
Toronto has a rapidly growing youth mental health crisis; hospitalizations doubled in the last decade.

Out-of-school activities have been shown to improve a child's academic outcomes. Yet, low income Toronto kids are 6X as likely not to participate regularly in arts or sports.

Half the children in aging high rises live in poverty – one of the highest concentrations of vulnerable people in the city.

Together We Are Transforming Lives

In 2019, thanks to your support, **2035** children and youth accessed Moorelands Kids' transformative programs.

We helped another **84 young people** with employment opportunities as program staff.

Because of your support, we were able to launch the inaugural *projectDIVE!* at Moorelands Camp. The pilot program exceeding its goal, reaching **113 participants**. *projectDIVE!* was an opportunity to serve kids more and offer a further escape from the stresses and demands of the city. It was a resounding success!

Speaking of camp... we grew again with **694 children** attending the summer 2019 sessions. The Camp Directors completed **451 hours** of extensive community outreach under the Gale Family Outreach Program, reaching even more of the kids who need us most: 87% of all campers qualified for a full subsidy to attend Moorelands Camp in 2019 compared to 75% in 2018. Of the remaining 13% subsidized campers, 12% received significant partial-subsidies and two returning campers paid their own full way this year as their family circumstances improved!

In our city after-school programs, we served **325 individual children**. The majority of BLAST children attended up to 5 days a week – a huge support to working families, including newcomers and those struggling to make ends meet.

A new initiative, Junior Leaders Day, was warmly embraced by *BLAST* kids. Older participants took on more responsibility and directed activities; allowing them to be better role models and mentors to younger participants.

The really big news was the unprecedented growth in our *LED* for middle-school kids. The *LED* expansion, launched September 2018, saw a jump of **181% in 2019** as word of mouth reached our new communities! This is what transformation looks like.

You provided **337 Baby Bundles** to moms and newborns in 2019. Did you know that most of our *Baby Bundle* families live on less than \$18,000 per year?

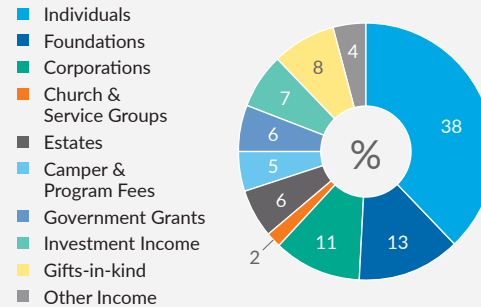

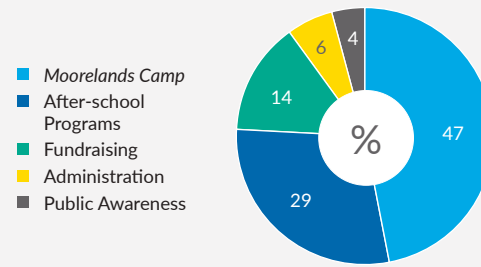

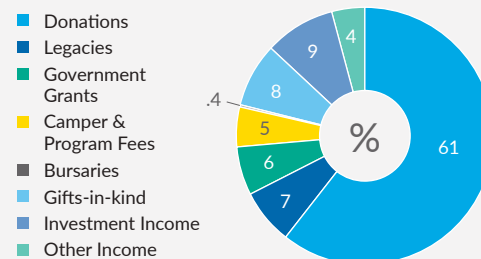
Revenue by Source (Operating Funds 2019)

Overview of 2019

As Chair of the Finance Committee I bring you the results of Moorelands Kids' Audited Financial Statements 2019.

A combination of committed but unrealized gifts and significant growth in children using our programs, as we actively seek to serve more kids, resulted in an operating deficit of \$76,000 in our \$1,857,000 Operating Budget.

This clearly speaks to the need for the work we do and to the critically important role our donors play in bringing opportunities to children.

The excellent news in this summary is that the Board and organization, as part of 100+ years of prudent fiscal planning, have tools in place to manage exactly this situation. We recognize that funding is cyclical in nature and maintain a healthy Operating Reserve of between four to six months of budgeted expense. As a result we are able to show a balanced year-end in our 2019 audited financials.

We present this re-balanced year in our complete audited financials, available online.

Moorelands Kids believes that no child in Toronto should ever have to live in poverty.

As is clear from our 2019 Operating Statement, children are in need. Only with your help and commitment will we continue to grow our reach and to empower children to transform out of poverty and into opportunity.

Why Now?

The need in numbers



Toronto is the income inequality capital of Canada. Between 1970 and 2015, income inequality grew by 68%.¹



No other part of the GTA has household incomes as low as the city of Toronto itself.²

To rent a one-bedroom apartment in Toronto, a household needs to earn \$69,520; 87% of camp families live on less than \$24,000 a year.³



The rate of child poverty is higher for newcomers – 1 child in every 2 is living below the poverty line.⁴



Children's mental health centres are at their limits with wait times as long as 18 months.⁵



Where Moorelands serves, the rate of child poverty rises to 3 in every 4 children.⁴



Toronto parents pay more for childcare than anywhere else in Canada. The median cost for an infant is \$1758/month.⁶

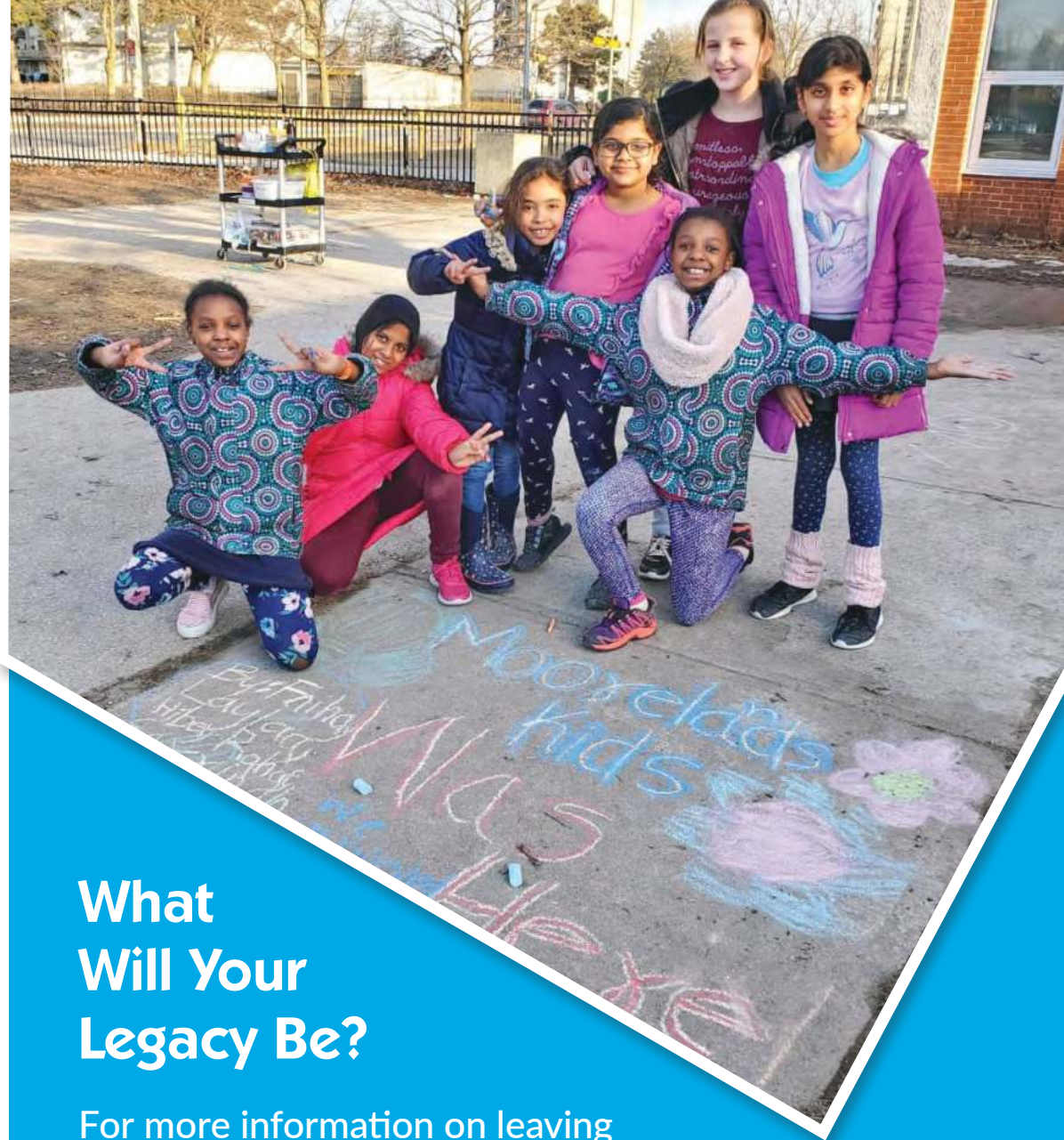
