Moorelands Kids' *Baby Bundles* program makes a big impact across Toronto thanks to amazing community connections. Not only do our bundles provide vital supplies to low-income moms and their newborns, the program links them with a health care worker and community workers who provide ongoing education and support. # Sapphire's Story, St. Stephen's The Neighbourhood Group

Moorelands Kids has been working with St. Stephen's since 2018. First time mom, Sapphire and her husband Paul have had a tough year. Newcomers to Canada without a network of support, they are struggling financially due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The company Paul works for has cut his hours severely. In a way, this feels worse than losing his job altogether because although his income has been reduced, he does not qualify for government support. The baby bundle the family received was a bright spot in a tough time. It not only helped them financially, providing supplies they could not afford, it gave them an understanding of what they needed for their baby. More important, it helped immensely in establishing rapport between the family and their new community worker at St. Stephen's. Now, thanks to your help, the family is accessing a range of supports from this

agency and their baby is off to a healthy start!




